Both Lion Stan and the Redding Breakfast Lions Club have justly earned the honors by devoting their time and money to upgrade the camp over the years.

Stan Story has been a Camp McCumber board member for numerous years and has taken on numerous projects to keep the camp in top notch shape. Some of the major undertakings were the construction of the large soccer field, installation of the fire boxes, remodeling the food preparation room,

installing insulation, sheetrock, doors and windows in 12 of the sleeping cabins. He designed and remodeled the caretaker's house by converting the breezeway and portion of the garage into useable space, installed a covered porch in front of the house, and built a covered patio area. Just last fall he completed rebuilding the entire swimming dock and constructed a trailer for moving the dock units. He was also responsible for the remodeling of the large rest room by installing plastic sheeting on the shower walls, painting the inside and installing wooded grating on the shower floors.

The Friday night dinner will be our **Food Fair**...Western style. Region and Zones

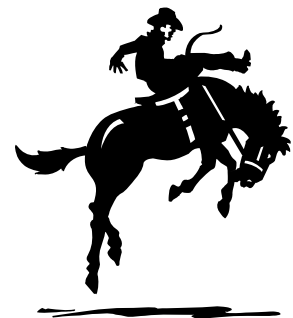

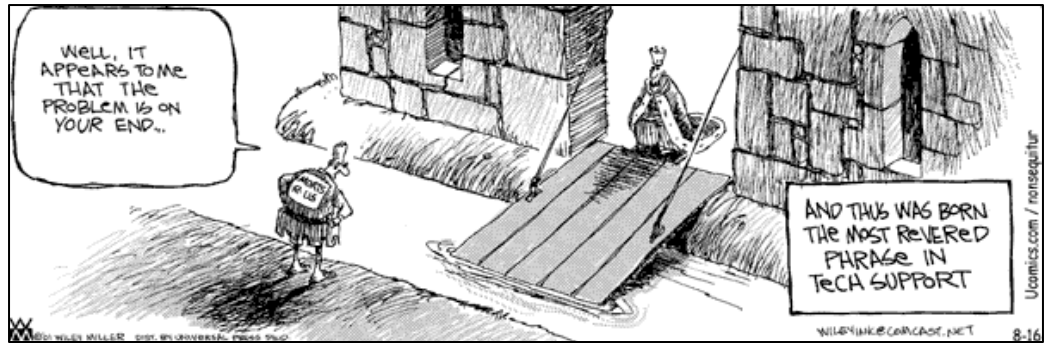
