The Internet – Hero or Villain

This is the topic for the 2005-06 Student Speakers Contest. This is a good topic as most students have a much greater knowledge of the computer and the Internet than most Lions members.

There is one major problem: the finances of the Student Speakers Contest. Last year, MD-4 paid out \$106,047 in scholarships and \$14,859 for Fellowship plaques.

Contributions from the 16 Districts totaled only \$67,533. This is a deficit of \$53,363. Only 4 of the 16 Districts contributed more than the \$4,000 that they received from the Student Speakers Foundation. Interest income last year was

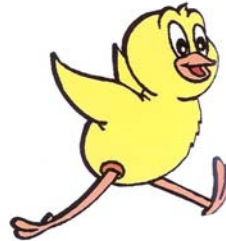
\$17,500 compared to \$40,000 - \$50,000 just two to three years ago.

A couple of months ago I reported that District 4-C1 had only contributed \$500 to the Student Speakers Foundation although we had already received \$4,000 for our scholarships.

We have 53 Lions Clubs in District 4-C1 and if each club would contribute \$100 each, we could easily pay back the \$4,000 that we receive. This Student Speech Contest is a great youth program and everyone enjoys the contest. Don't let this program die because of the lack of funding.

First Ever Bike Run

The Enterprise Lions Club of Redding, California, organized the first Anderson River Park Bike Ride on May 21, 2005. Cosponsors included the Anderson Lions Club and the city of Anderson Parks and Recreation Department. Many hours were spent and numerous meetings held under the direction of bike ride event chairman Bob Wagner. Preplanning included a seven-month time frame to insure all aspects of the ride were covered and routes properly selected. Those who staffed rest stops on ride day included the Happy Valley Lions Club and the Redding Host Lions Club. Communication throughout the ride was provided by radio thanks to Shasta Tehama Amateur Emergency Services. The Cottonwood Lions Club loaned equipment for the ride. Over one-

hundred (100) riders arrived at Anderson River Park and at sign-in enjoyed a continental breakfast. Riders paid a fee to ride the 25-mile, 60 mile or 100 mile course following pre-designated routes. Lunch was served at two rest stops for the longer rides. The entry fees included dinner prepared by Lions. About fifty sponsors received a free shirt and framed certificate of appreciation. Some sponsors contributed money while others donated goods. Praise for the ride organization, food provided and quality of the course layout was resounding from riders. All volunteers wore the ride shirt and enjoyed dinner at the end of their assignment. Over \$4,000 profit was divided among the volunteer groups. The second annual ride is scheduled for **May 20, 2006**.

District 4-C1 Transitional Cabinet Meeting

Shasta Region
 DG Robert D. Prah
 July 17, 2005

The meeting was called to order by VDG/RC Steve Robeson at 9 am. The pledge was led by Lion Barbara Gussman and the song was led by Lion Donna Kendall. The invocation was given by DC Joe Schwarm.

DG Bob Prah welcomed all and introduced all PDG present.

The Secretary's report was approved as printed in the Mane Lion.

The Treasurer's report (attached to original only) was approved at presented.

Region Reports

Shasta Region: VDG Steve Robeson reports 342 Lions with no losses no gains. Average attendance 77%. Fund Raiders were 38 for 789 MH and \$20,605.00 earned. Service Projects were 132 for 2019 MH and \$23,595.00 spent. There are 7 clubs in the regions publishing bulletins. Official Club visitations by clubs was 4 and 4 visitations were made by the RC.

Lassen Region: RC Roger Hendricsen (read by Lion Patty Shores) reports a loss of 17 Lions in the Lassen Region. Average attendance was 75%. Fund raisers were 86 for 1008 MH and \$10,493.00 raised. Service Projects were 178 for 4234 MH and \$24,972.00 spent. There are 5 clubs publishing bulletins. Official Club visitation was 4 and the RC made 2 visitations.

North Butte: RC Jill Collins reports that 5 club reports were not turned into her so the net loss or gain is not known at this time. Of the clubs reporting there were 57 fundraisers for 1850 MH and \$16,459 raised. Service projects were 114 for 2217 MH and \$ 17,623.00 spent. There are 5 clubs publishing bulletins. There were 3 official club visitations and no visitations made by the RC.

South Butte: RC Paul Halcomb reports a net gain of 6 for the region. Average attendance was 64%. There were 31 fundraisers for 664 MH and \$16,566.72 raised. Service projects were 122 for 1456 MH and \$12,586.60 spent. Four clubs are publishing bulletins. Official Club visitations were 4 and the RC did not make any visitations.

Committee Reports

City of Hope: Lion Genevieve Hobson presented awards to the following clubs.

- Division IV – Cottonwood Lions and Sunset Butte Lioness-Lions
- Lioness – Chico Lioness

Disaster Committee: DG Bob Prah reported on the Bear and French Gulch fires.

Peace Poster Contest: DG Bob Prah was disappointed in last year's participation of only 2 clubs. He would like to see 1 club per zone hold a contest. You need to start working with the school districts as soon as school starts.

MERLO Team: DG Bob Prah is ordering new shirts for the team and they need to contact VDG Steve Robeson and give him your size.

Mane Lion Final Report: Lion Skip O'Brien reports last year printing costs were \$551.00, sales tax was \$39.95 and postage was \$706.39. It cost approximately 66 cents for each of the 150 copies mailed each month. E-mail circulation is now 297. We wish there were some way to insure that copies mailed to the clubs are circulated among the members. The DG, VDG, Region and Zone Chairs should emphasize this on their visitations.

LCIF/LEHP: PDG Bob Trueax reports that as of June 30, 2005 District 4-C1 has contributed at least \$10,261 for the South Asia Tsunami Relief Fund. We have also contributed at least another \$5,455 in unspecified donations. Two clubs, Sutter and Gridley were 100% Contributing Members and Chico Breakfast had 32 Contributing members. From these donations 9 Melvin Jones Fellowships will be credited to the district for 2004-2005 and an additional one for 2005-2006. Enterprise and Redding Host are working on a Habitat for Humanity project.

Health Foundation: VDG Steve Robeson reports a very successful youth diabetes camp this June. We hosted 35 youth from our district. We attempted a deaf camp but could not get enough campers and counselors. We will attempt one again next year. Thanks to PDG Dave Marceau for his extensive efforts. PDG Bob Trueax has established a liaison with the Superior CA branch of the American Lung Assoc and will attend their camp as a helper.

Humanitarian Foundation: PDG John Buffington reports the new officers for 2005-2006 is President PDG John Buffington, VP Lion Mark Smith, Secretary Lion Genevieve Hobson, and Treasurer Lion Skip O'Brien. The disaster funds are being held in two accounts and the 2 treasurers will consolidate the funds if possible. The foundation accepted with regrets the resignation as advisor of Brent Wilson. He was made an Honorary Director Emeritus for his devotion and years of service. The foundation has \$98,623.24 in its accounts.

Budget & Finance: PDG John Buffington reports the District is operating on the approved budget for the 2005-2006 year. Members of the Budget committee are: Chairman Lion Virgil White, Lassen Region, Lion Dwanye Tanabe for the North Butte, Lion Donna Kendall for the Shasta Region and Lion Don Ruble for South Butte, IPDG Chuck Davis and Lion Larry Lewis Cabinet Treasurer.

All Star Football Game: PDG Joe Hinton reports the game is July 30th at Shasta College. They are working on having the game at Butte College next year. New Football pins are available for \$3.00 each.

Pin Chairman: PDG Joe Hinton reports the new District 4-C1 Red Tail pin has arrived and the cost is \$2.00 each.

Lions in Sight: PDG Joe Hinton says there is no new information from MD-4. September 25th Lions will collect glasses at the 49er game. December 4th is Lions Day at the 49er game and we are putting together a trip. See our DG for details.

Gift of Life: PDG Dorothy Buffington reports the need has not changed, make sure your family knows your wishes. For a speaker call N CA Transplant bank 242-9123.

Proud Lion: PDG Dorothy Buffington has 15 turned in so far this year. This is one of the best programs for new Lions.

Spirit Enhancement: PDG Dorothy has no complaints about poor Lion spirits.

Women's Membership: PDG Dorothy Buffington reports our District has 358 women Lions. We have 12 clubs with no women and 2 clubs with no men.

Convention Final Report: PDG Dorothy Buffington reports we had 176 registered Lions. A motion was made and approved to appoint a committee to change the constitution and bylaws for the convention expenses. We will return \$3,779.17 this year.

Leos: PDG Stan Story reports that nothing is happening at this time.

Camp McCumber: PDG Stan Story reports the next Cabinet meeting will be held at Camp McCumber September 10th. The camp will open for work parties the week before.

Environment: Lion John Brooks says he has no report but he is attending water meeting and we can contact him for speakers.

Mane Lion/Web Master Lion Mick Shatswell wants everything from the clubs. The deadline for submitting articles to the Mane Lion is the 20th of each month. There is no deadline for the Website.

ZC Ray Marshner brought up the possibility of just having a camp for kids with no issues. Perhaps Lions kids or grandkids or kids sponsored by local Lions Clubs.

It was approved to establish an Ad Hoc committee to explore the possibility of having a healthily kids camp. Lions Ray Marshner and Mark Smith head this project.

IDPG Chuck Davis thanked Lions for finding him. What attracted him to Lions is that every dollar went back into the community. This was a way to give back to the community. If Lions had not found him he would not have met any of us. IDPG Chuck Davis was given a standing ovation of thanks for a great year of service to District 4-C1.


