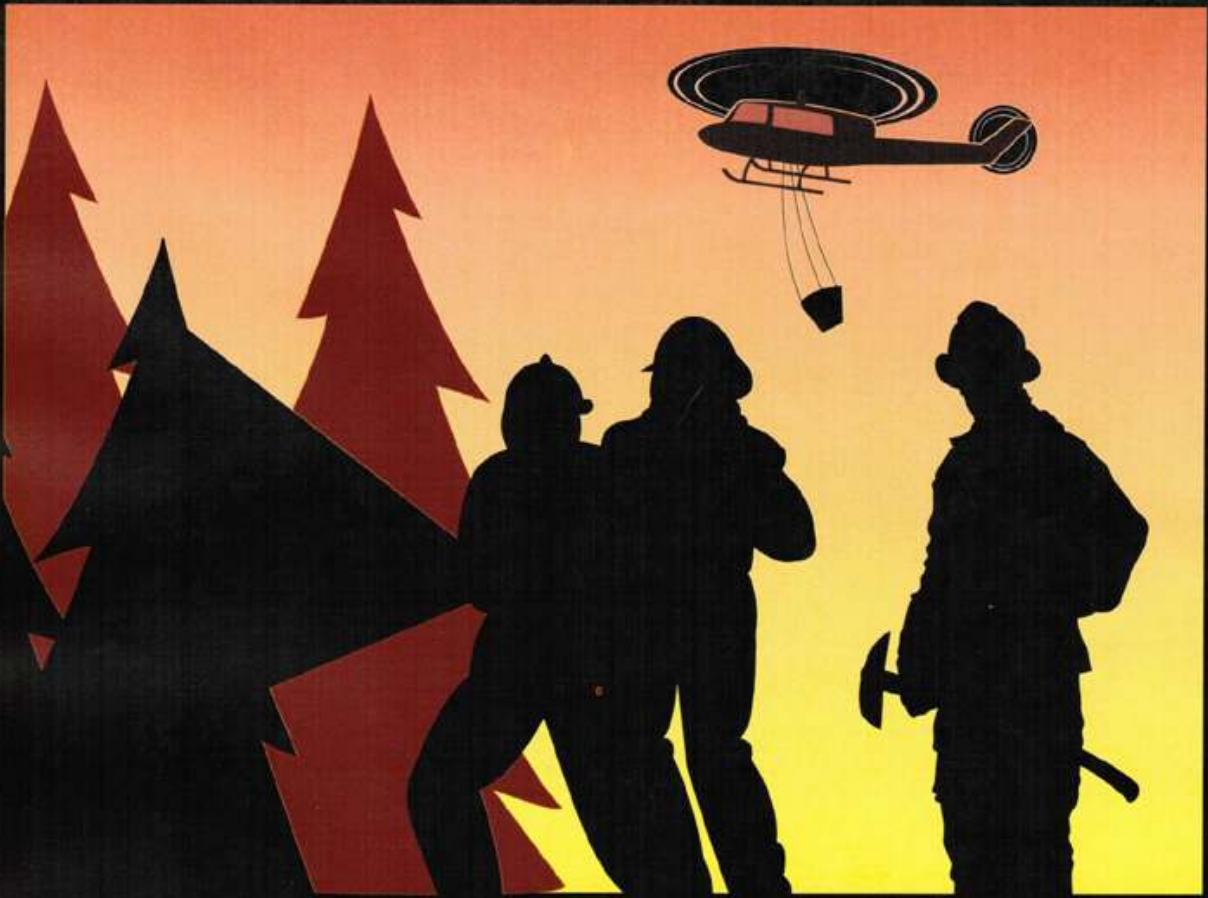

**For what groups do you volunteer?** Linda Lions Club for about the past six years. I am immediate past president after serving as president for 21/2 years. We just got done in June with the second Hot Linda Nights, a major undertaking. The 28 members in the club each did what they could. It gives you purpose when you have direction in a major project.

As president I turned the club's direction to schools.

The club keeps me grounded. No matter what's going on in your life, the problems or the good stuff, if you have to do this one thing once a week it keeps you on an even keel.

I've been the Neighborhood Watch block captain for 11 years. The program is keep an eye on the neighborhood, but mainly to communicate with neighbors and keep an eye on each other. I try to keep our neighborhood informed to know what's going on around and get to know each other, socialize. I have also put on a few National Night Out events.

One thing I did as a child that impacts my life now was taking care of people with disabilities. I was a teacher's assistant in a special ed class during my senior year at Del Campo School in Carmichael.

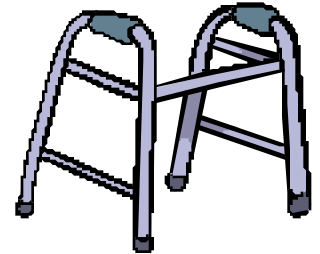

Sarah was very devoted to her family and especially loved family gatherings with her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She is preceded in death by her husband, Bryant, and son, David and is survived by her son, Ray (Darlene); brother, Gail (Wanda) Zimmeman; uncle, John Thode; grandchildren, Rebekkah Vera (Tony) and Nathaniel Odom (Megan) and great-grandchildren, Hailey, Bryant, Katy, and Allison.
