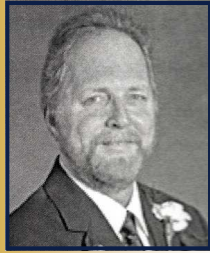

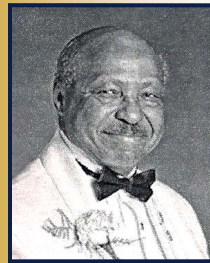

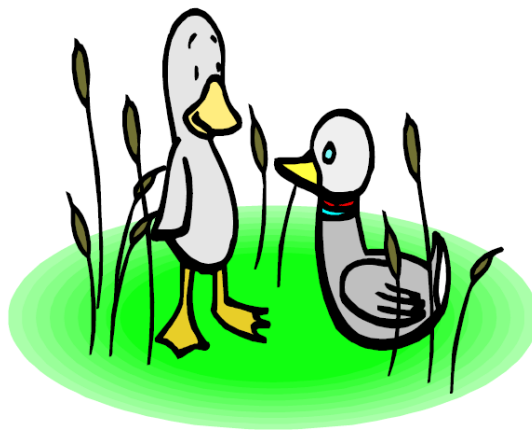

Improvements to the Lions Club Service Activity Report

The Lions Club Service Activity Report, which is part of the Web Monthly Membership Reporting (WMMR), is an important means to measure the global impact Lions are making through service to their communities. The report was recently redesigned to be a better tool for clubs to plan service activities and share information with others. Clubs are now able to:

- Provide a narrative description for each activity.
- Upload up to two photos for each activity.
- See a list of activities completed each month and share this information with their club and district leaders.
- Access a variety of service project planning resources.

As the report application is further developed, clubs will also be able to:

- Share service activity information with other clubs.
- Generate custom reports that can be saved and emailed.
- Use a variety of templates (such as press releases and newsletters) to promote Lions' service.
- Set service objectives and track progress toward achieving them.

Training

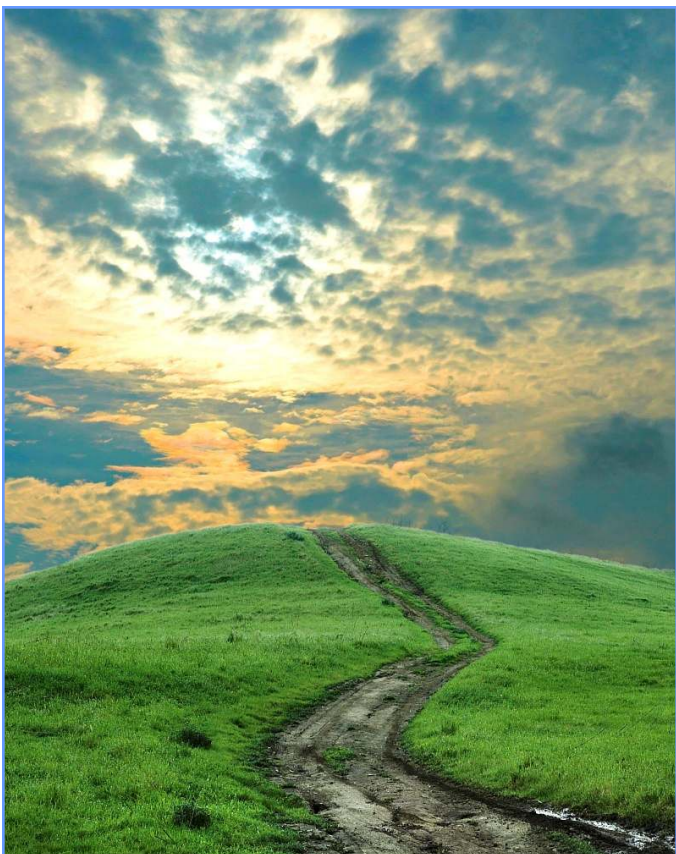

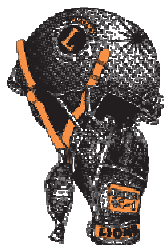

Note to All Lions in 4C1

When you are making out your generous donation list , or updating your wills, I hope you have time to remember to continue helping Canine Companions for Independence. This is our program which provides trained dogs for the disabled at no cost to the recipients. Unfortunately, due to our country's involvement in several wars, there is an increased need for more service dogs for a number of injured veterans.

One way to help is to use the Shares Program to raise funds thanks to the Lucky Stores chain, Savemart, Food for Less, Lucky stores. For those not familiar with this, the card looks like a charge card which you merely hand to the cashier at one of those stores , as you check out with your purchases. The cashier punches in the number, and the approved amounts are forwarded to the Headquarters where every three months, the total is computed and a check forwarded to Foothill Lions payable direct to CCI. You do not have to be a Lion to use the cards and they may be replaced if lost . Not all items, such as stamps, gift cards, liquor, are counted but the majority of groceries do count.

To date we have received several hundred dollars from this effort which goes directly for the CCI program.

If you shop at these stores, please make sure to carry your card with you at all times, it only takes a minute to do the transaction.

Answers to New Year's Quiz

1. **A** - "Auld Lang Syne," which means "times gone by," is an extremely old Scottish song that was first written down in the 1700s.
2. **C** - The pattern that an aerial shell paints in the sky depends on the arrangement of star pellets inside the shell.
3. **C** - The place that was the first to celebrate New Year's on Jan. 1, 2000, was situated along the International Date Line, which runs through the Pacific Ocean slightly to the west of Hawaii. Hawaii was therefore one of the very last places to celebrate the new year
4. **B** - Avoid using scissors or knives, or else you may cut off your chances for a lucky new year.
5. **A** - The Times Square celebration started in 1904 to commemorate the opening of the new headquarters of the New York Times.
